## **DIRECTIVE 2011/65/EU OF THE EUROPEAN PARLIAMENT AND OF THE COUNCIL of 8 June 2011 on the restriction of the use of certain hazardous substances in electrical and electronic equipment (RoHS II)**

Directive 2011/65/EU (RoHS II) restricts the use of certain hazardous substances in electrical and electronic equipment. Thus electrical and electronic equipment that is in the scope of the directive may not contain Pb, Hg, Cr(VI), PBB and PBDE above 0,1% and Cd above 0,01% in the homogenous material unless an exemption, defined by the directive, is applicable.

HARTING is aware of the regulations of directive 2011/65/EU and, in particular, of the requirements of customers. Although most HARTING products are not in the scope of 2011/65/EU, nearly all HARTING products comply with the composition requirements of 2011/65/EU.

Namely the following product groups do not contain substances restricted by directive 2011/65/EU (RoHS II) above the allowed maximum concentration or an exemption listed in annex III of the directive is applicable:
