




Relative Spectral Emission⁴⁾

Radiation Characteristics⁴⁾








Pins 1: Substrate potential, isolated from Cathode and Anode Pins 2: Anode Ding 2: Cathode







Barcode-Product-Label (BPL)




Barcode-Tray-Label (BTL)





Schematic Transportation Box 7)


